

# For Parents: Parental Responsibility part 2

Obviously, the first parents were Adam and Eve. The Bible gives the names of three of their children (though, they had many more). Cain and Abel were the two brothers with the most trouble, resulting in murder. But the question I ask is, "Who taught Cain and Abel the things they knew about God?"

If you read the story in Genesis 4, both brothers brought a sacrifice to God. Who taught them to bring a sacrifice? Abel brought the firstborn from his flock. Who taught him to do that?

The answer has to be Adam and Eve, his parents. Everything these brothers learned about God, they learned from their parents.

After Cain murdered Abel, Adam and Eve had another son named Seth. Genesis 5 records a

continuous succession of men from Adam through Seth's lineage who were followers of God. Who taught these men to follow and fear God? Later on, Noah, a descendent of Seth, was the most righteous man living at the time before the flood (that's really not saying very much).

An interesting note, Genesis 9:6 appears to be the first implications of a system of government. What is interesting about this is that prior to this time, legalities would have been dealt with by the family structure. The father was the ruler of the family. He made all the decisions and everyone obeyed him. When there was a murder that needed to be avenged, the family took care of vengeance. In Genesis 9:6, God was declaring a more "civilized" way of handling the murder of a family member.

Prior to that, the family was all that a person had to fall back on. Even after that, it appears as though the family was the primary avenger in the case of a murder. This was a cultural thing which led God to establish "cities of refuge" in Israel. They were for a manslayer to go before the "avenger of blood" caught and killed him in revenge for an accidental death (see Numbers 35).

Religious knowledge was handed down from parent to child. Social knowledge was handed down from parent to child. "Scholastic" knowledge was handed down from parent to child (see Genesis 4:20-21). This was the way of things until the priesthood was instituted. But did the priesthood change the expectation that parents would train their own children?
